National Blue Ribbon Lighthouse Schools of Excellence

Oconee County Primary and Oconee County Elementary have been recognized as National Blue Ribbon Lighthouse Schools of Excellence. They earned the recognition based on nine categories of the Blueprint for Excellence: Student Focus and Support; School Organization and Culture; Challenging Standards



and Curriculum; Active Teaching and Learning; Technology Integration; Professional Community; Leadership and Educational Vitality; School, Community, and Family Partnerships; and Indicators of Success. Since 2003, 289 schools nationwide have been chosen as Lighthouse Schools of Excellence — and now eight are from Oconee County.

Max Patrick, who portrayed Poe, was named Best Actor, and Lydia Peck and Sydney Singer were chosen for the All-Star Cast.


November News & Notes ...
