Grading System:

A = 90 – 100

**Method of Computing GPA:** Numerical average of all courses taken. AP courses and Dual Enrollment courses are awarded 10 % weight and Honors courses are awarded 5% weight to the “weighted GPA.” No additional points are added to the final average that appears on transcript in an AP, Dual Enrollment or Honors class.

**Class Rank:** Based upon weighted numerical averages of entire class. Class rank will be calculated in May of each school year.
