COMMUNITY AND LOCATION

Oconee County is adjacent to Athens, Georgia and is approximately 1 ½ hours from Atlanta. It is a growing suburban community of more than 32,000. Currently 17% of students are served through the free/reduced lunch program. The University of North Georgia has a campus in Oconee county. The University of Georgia is located in Athens as well as Athens Technical College and a satellite branch of Piedmont College.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

Most courses are taught in two 18-week semesters/4X4 block schedule earning credit at the end of the semester. Some classes are taught on an A/B modified block with courses meeting every day all year. These courses do not earn any credit until the end of the school year

Requirements for Graduation

Students are required to earn 28 units for graduation. Included in these units must be courses which meet the state of Georgia's requirements in addition to the additional academics required by the Oconee County Board of Education.

GPA Computation

Grades earned in courses identified as honors, Advanced Placement, or dual-enrolled with a local college receive the following weighting

Honors = 1.05

Advanced Placement = 1.10

Dual Enrollment = 1.10

This weighting is not applied to individual grades on the transcript but is applied when the cumulative average is calculated. Courses with no identifier and identified as advanced earn no weighting. Class rank is determined by the weighted cumulative grade point average at the end of each semester and is computed on a 100-point scale.

Dual Enrollment

Juniors and Seniors are allowed to participate in up to a total of 30 hours of dual enrollment. Most students dual enroll at the University of North Georgia, University of Georgia, Athens Technical College and Georgia Military College

Over the last 5 years, **over 1/3** of our graduates have taken at least 1 Advanced Placement Course. **80.2%** of those students scored a 3 or better on the AP test
