ACADEMICS AT OCONEE COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL

COURSES OFFERED

Students have the opportunity to take advanced courses throughout high school via honors classes and Advanced Placement courses. At OCHS, honors courses are offered for high achieving students and for those who meet the state requirements for gifted classification. Honors courses are offered in language arts, mathematics, social studies, and the sciences.

SCHEDULE

Most courses are taught in two 18-week semesters/4X4 block schedule earning credit at the end of the semester.

Some classes are taught on an A/B modified block with courses meeting every day all year. These courses do not earn any credit until the end of the school year.

GPA COMPUTATION

Grades earned in courses identified as honors, Advanced Placement, or dual-enrolled with a local college receive the following weighting:

- Honors = 1.05
- Advanced Placement = 1.10
- Dual Enrollment = 1.10

This weighting is not applied to individual grades on the transcript, but is applied when the cumulative average is calculated. Courses with no identifier and identified as advanced earn no weighting.

Class rank is determined by the weighted cumulative grade point average at the end of each semester and is computed on a 100-point scale.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students are required to earn 28 total units for graduation. Included in these units must be courses which meet the state of Georgia's requirements, in addition to the additional academics required by the Oconee County Board of Education.

DUAL ENROLLMENT

Juniors and Seniors are allowed to participate in up to a total of 30 hours of dual enrollment. Most students dual enroll at the University of North Georgia, University of Georgia, Athens Technical College, and/or Georgia Military College.

For the class of 2022, 200 students participated in Dual Enrollment.

WORK-BASED LEARNING

Oconee County High School offers Work-Based Learning opportunities through individual job shadowing, internships, and co-ops in our community. OCHS also offers Work-Based Learning opportunities through formal Youth Apprenticeship programs, such as Young Dawgs with University of Georgia.

For the Class of 2022, 54 students total completed in the Work-Based Learning program with 13 of those students participants of Young Dawgs.

In the 21-22 school year, OCHS WBL students earned a total of \$74,162 with 12,294 hours worked. In addition, our Youth Apprenticeship students earned a total of \$61,183.00 with 12,281 hours worked.
